Mr. Hopke embodies the energy, integrity and genuine passion for serving students that the Board identified as essential qualities for its next leader.

### Roof Snow Load Update

Like many property owners, the School also dealt with too much snow. A unique situation occurred when a mass of snow and ice from the slanted gym roof, slid down onto a lower section of roof. This 15 x 120 foot section of roof by the cafeteria and office hallway experienced extra stress on trusses.

Thanks to the guick work of Maintenance Director Mark Dahlberg, we promptly obtained help from an engineering firm and Paul's Sheet Metal and Roofing in Rice Lake. Sufficient snow was removed and the Engineer deemed the affected trusses to be safe, so school could be re-opened. In the future, some cosmetic repairs will be provided by a general contractor, Vonasek & Schieffer from Rice Lake, WI.

We appreciate the guick work of many staff to get virtual learning activities taking place so quickly. We also appreciate the cooperation and understanding of parents. Besides the building being safe, the other good news is that the two missed days of school will not have to be made up because our current calendar meets the State Standards for Hours of Instruction!





He travels the country speaking to military groups, schools, and other organizations.


For our elementary students, Mr. Bartley will share stories about the animals in his sanctuary and how they relate to emotions. He talks about happiness and sadness and how to share difficult emotions with adults, reminding students that it feels good when we get that stuff out. ### The School Levy Tax Credit

Part of the state's commitment to fund education comes in the form of the school levy tax credit. What makes this aspect of funding confusing is that, while the state considers these dollars a part of its commitment to education, this credit is not paid directly to schools. Instead they function to offset individual school property tax bills. In effect, through these credits, the state "buy down" a portion of each taxpayer's property tax bill. In November, when a school district sets it property tax levy, it sets a gross levy amount. In December, when property tax bills are issued, the bills show a net levy amount. The difference is paid by the state through these credits. The amounts allotted through [the levy credit] are based on a formula that generally provides more funds to municipalities that have higher property taxes for schools.

### How is the school levy tax credit calculated?

Formula for calculating the school levy tax credit: Municipality's 3-Year Average School Levies Statewide

### 3-Year Average School Levies x Total Funding = Municipality's Credit

- Is the school levy tax credit paid to the school district? No. The
  Wisconsin Department of Revenue (DOR) distributes this credit to
  counties and municipalities. DOR makes the payments directly to
  the county where the municipality is located and then the county
  distributes the payment to the municipality.
- When are town, villages and cities notified of the school levy tax credit amount? DOR must inform municipalities of their school levy tax credit payments on or before November 20 of each year.
- How is the school levy tax credit reported on individual property tax bills? On property tax bill, the school levies are reported after subtracting the school levy tax credits. The amount of the school levy tax credit for the current year is listed in a separate box on each property tax bill.
- How does a property owner qualify for the school levy tax credit?
  The school levy tax credit is applied to every taxable property. The
  credit amount is based on the property's assessed value as a
  percent of the municipality's total assessed value.

Tax Levy History Update - The above chart shows the amount of school taxes that have been levied since 2016. Since 2016, the amount of local taxes for Solon Springs School declined by 15% - that means a reduction of about \$390,000. Why did this occur? The main reason is that Solon Springs is attracting more students. This increases State Aid.


