Greetings families and community members:

It is hard to believe that we have reached the end of the 2024-25 school year already. It has been a productive year that has gone by in a flash. The District has been hard at work with improvement plans, increased collaboration, and exploration of new opportunities for our students. The District had students participate in Superior Days to get a better understanding of how our state government operates. Students were able to interact with legislators from across the state in Madison and discuss topics that are impacting the District and community. We are adding Spanish and Family and Consumer Education classes for MS and HS students in 2025-26. We are continuing to refine a consistent schedule for elementary, middle school, and high school that focuses on both universal instruction as well as interventions for students who need more intensive instruction. We have established a new mission, vision, and commitments for the District to drive our work. We have established essential standards in reading and English Language Arts that focus our instruction across the District to increase student performance and achievement. This summer, the District is conducting a building assessment and study to determine infrastructure needs for our current building and facilities as well as potential issues that will need to be addressed with a capital improvement to add space for the daycare, workout space, and a couple classrooms. The bids for the study were requested in May and will be presented in August. The intent is to have information for families and community members at the Open House event at the end of August. This will give families and community members an opportunity to ask questions and provide feedback as we develop more definitive plans for this potential project. Finally, I would like to wish everyone a wonderful, fun, and safe summer. Enjoy spending time outdoors and participating in activities with family and friends. We look forward to seeing students returning in the fall.

#### Track Season 2025



## CONGRATULATIONS ON BEING LAKELAND EAST CONFERENCE CHAMPS FOR THE 5<sup>th</sup> YEAR IN A ROW!

N/SS baseball had another successful season. The defending WIAA Division 4 State Runner-ups won their fifth consecutive conference championship. Senior Jared Schultz and junior Isaiah Ahlberg led the team with great pitching and hitting. The two have combined for 32 hits, 7 doubles, 2 triples, a homerun, 50 runs and 48 stolen bases offensively. On the mound, they've pitched to a 7-2 record across 68 innings, giving up only 16 earned runs and 45 hits while striking out 148 batters. Ahlberg also threw a perfect game against Birchwood/Winter in April, the first perfect game in program history. N/SS will play Bruce or Prentice in a WIAA Regional final, with the winner advancing to Sectionals in Athens on June 10th.














## Published Authors in E1






## Shop Talk







#### Household Application for Summer EBT

Most eligible students will automatically receive Summer EBT benefits and do not need to apply if they are receiving free or reduced price meals at their school.

However, there are some households with eligible students that will need to apply. You may need to apply if:

- you may be eligible for Summer EBT benefits via your household's income and do not want to apply for free or reduced price meal benefits at your student's school.
- your student is enrolled in a school that participates in the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) where all meals are provided to students at no cost and your household does not participate in FoodShare, W-2 Cash Benefits, FDPIR, and/or certain income based Medicaid programs, and you think you may be eligible for Summer EBT benefits based on your household's income.


#### District Solo & Ensemble
